**Dredge and fill applications/permits:**

- Henry Boyd and Mark West were representing Dean Koravos of 6 Manchester Street. They would like to remove the existing asphalt and replaced it with pervious pavers. They would like to remove an existing fence which is on Town property and restore the dunes. They would also like to plant different beach plants like beach plum, bay berry, beach grass and beach pee in about 3,000 square feet for dune restoration. They will need to take out a Shoreline Impact Permit from NH DES. Mark West will be obtaining the permit.

Henry Boyd and Mark West have explained the intent plan. The Conservation Commission has no objections to the plan as it was presented. The activity on Town property is removing the protrusion onto Town Property, removing the lawn behind the fence and return it to its natural habitat and they will be putting a privacy fence on their own property.
