- NHDES sent the Conservation Commission a letter stating that the permit for 17 Anchor Way was approved to dredge and fill 2,666 sq.ft (2,221 sf permanent and 445 sf temporary construction impacts) in palustrine forested/scrub-shrub wet lands to construct a driveway with two (2) culvert crossings to access two (2) proposed single family homes on a 1.26 parcel of land.
