

§ 202-5. Relation to other legislation.

This article is intended to supplement, not to replace, any other laws, statutes or other rules governing the subject to which it is addressed.

§ 202-6. Severability.

If any provision of article or any portion of such provision or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the article and the remainder of such provisions and the application thereof to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

ARTICLE III**Launching Ramp**

[Adopted 3-10-1988 ATM by Art. 54²]

§ 202-7. Public float and pier.

No person shall leave a vessel moored to the public float or attached to the public pier for a period of more than 48 hours, without expressed written permission of the Board of Selectmen, with the exception of rowboats not exceeding 15 feet in length, which may be moored to the public float on designated sides.

§ 202-8. Loading and unloading equipment.

No person shall place or deposit on the public float or public pier, any fish, lobster, bait, lobster traps, barrels, boxes, gear, nets or other fishing equipment for any period longer than is reasonably necessary for the prompt loading or unloading of same.

§ 202-9. Violation and penalties.

Violations of any provision of this article shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 per day and prosecution for criminal trespass under the NH Criminal Code.

§ 202-10. Enforcement.

The provisions of this article may be enforced by duly appointed members of the Seabrook Police Department and/or the Harbor Master appointed by the State of New Hampshire.

ARTICLE IV

Seabrook Beach Rules and Regulations

[Adopted 5-15-1980 by the Board of Selectmen, ratified 3-13-1980 ATM by Art. 16]

§ 202-11. Alcoholic beverages. ³

Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the beach.

§ 202-12. Motor vehicles. ⁴

Motor vehicles of any kind are not permitted on the beach.

§ 202-13. Sleeping in vehicles. ⁵

Sleeping in vehicles during nighttime hours is not permitted.

§ 202-14. Soliciting. ⁶

Soliciting of any kind is prohibited.

§ 202-15. Hours of operation; fishing hours.

The beach is closed to all public use between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and sunrise.

- A. Fishing from shore above the high water mark is only permitted from 8:00 p.m. until 1:00 a.m. and from 30 minutes before sunrise until 8:00 a.m. **[Added BOS 3-17-2010]**

§ 202-16. Open fires and charcoal grills.

- A. Open fires are not permitted on the public beaches.
- B. Permits for the use of charcoal grills may be obtained from the Fire Chief, provided that coals are doused and removed after use.

§ 202-17. Glass bottles.

Glass bottles shall not be permitted on the beach or in the water.
