§ 236-1. Fences required for certain pools.

All outdoor, artificial pools which have a maximum depth of more than three feet when filled to capacity shall have a wall, fence or other enclosure with a minimum height of four feet constructed around the entire pool, except aboveground pools having an elevation of four feet or higher above ground level.

§ 236-2. Fence to restrain children to use of gate.

The wall, fence or enclosure shall be constructed so that children will be unable to crawl or pass through to the pool without first using the gate or door to the pool.

§ 236-3. Gates to be locked when pool unattended.

All gates and doors shall be locked by a hasp or other comparable locking device when the pool is unattended.

§ 236-4. Compliance required.

All existing pools must comply with the terms of this chapter no later than June 1, 1980.

§ 236-5. Violations and penalties.

Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a fine of \$100.
