ARTICLE 17 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to be added to the existing Police Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund previously established? This is a special warrant article. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen) (Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Estimated \$0.014 impact per \$1,000 on the tax rate). NOTE: This article is included in the Capital Improvement Plan submitted to the Planning Board. This article would allow the Town to begin saving for the purchase of police equipment, due in 2025. The equipment will include replacement of firearms, tasers, protective vests, and digital equipment for cruisers. The combined cost is estimated at \$205,000.00. The current balance in this fund is \$72,896.	YES C
ARTICLE 18 To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a five-year lease/purchase agreement in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the acquisition and equipping of a multi-passenger bus for the Recreation Department, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for the first year's payment for that purpose. This lease/purchase agreement contains an escape clause.
