



# The Seabrook Police Department



## 2026 State and Local Laws and Ordinances

- Dogs are **ONLY** allowed on the beach after 6pm and before 8am from Memorial Day to Labor Day. All dogs **MUST** be on a leash and under control of their pet owner. All animal waste **MUST** be cleaned up immediately.
- The beach is closed from 1:00am until sunrise for all public use.
- Fireworks are **NOT** permissible for **display** in the Seabrook Beach Village District on private or public property. (Purchasing of Fireworks is legal)
- There are **NO** open containers of alcoholic beverages allowed on any public way to include the beach.
- There are **NO** glass containers allowed on the beach.
- Please observe the "Carry In-Carry Out" ordinance; any trash is to be removed by owner.
- There are **NO** open fires allowed on the beach.
- There are **NO** motor vehicles allowed on the beach or where otherwise posted.
- Parking is designated by posted signs and **WILL** be enforced for residents and non-residents.
- There is **NO** parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, 20 feet of an intersection or 50 feet of a dead end road.
- There is **NO** parking on a sidewalk/crosswalk, Beach Right of Way or blocking a driveway.
- Handicap parking **WILL** be enforced.
- Sleeping in vehicles during nighttime hours is **NOT** permitted.
- All violations of Seabrook Town Ordinances are a "**MUST APPEAR IN COURT**" summons. The penalty is a fine of up to \$1,000.00.
- Parking fines may be as much as \$200.00 per violation and must be paid within 10 days by mail, online, or in person at the Seabrook Police Dept. Do not mail cash. Pay only by a Postal Note, Money Order or by check made payable to: Seabrook Police Department, 7 Liberty Lane Seabrook, NH 03874.

***Parking violation appeals due to stickers/placards not being properly displayed will be denied.***
