Chairman Kelly opened the meeting at 10:00AM.

MONTHLY MEETING - LIBRARY DIRECTOR

Ann Robinson was present for her monthly report.

AARP - ongoing through Monday, April 16.

<u>Story time</u> - will begin on April 18. Several things have been setup for April vacation including animal times, WII games and movie day.

<u>Kilowatt Usage Monitor</u> - is now available for borrowing. This will allow you to see what your appliances are using for energy.

<u>DVD's & Music CD's</u> - are also available for borrowing.

<u>NH Recovery Program</u> - Ms. Robinson attended this meeting and found it informative on ways to receive additional funds.

Mr. Kelly asked about the museum passes. Ms. Robinson said they have some but these were cut with the latest budget. She is going to try fundraising to keep the Museum of Science. The Children's Museum they will keep.

Maria Brown commented that Ann Robinson is doing a wonderful job at the library. She said she would request a night meeting monthly so the public could be informed of things going on in the Town as a lot of people probably did not know about the museum passes. Mr. Kelly said they would be having a night meeting on May 6.

Ann Robinson left at 10:10AM.

MONTHLY MEETING - DPW MANAGER

John Starkey was present for his monthly report.

<u>Harborside Park</u> - money has been received from the State but not enough to complete the entire project. The project will be done in phases and the first phase is the fencing. Mr. Starkey is also going to request pricing for a gate.

<u>Paving</u> - he is recommending to wait on Farm Lane due to the new sub-division coming into Town. He suggested paving Lower Collins Street as it serves the main roads and also has a large mobile home park. He is also recommending Spur Road and the northwesterly end of Weare Road.

<u>Electronic Waste</u> - the first 15000 lbs. will be free and anything after 15000 would be 1-cent per pound.

Leachate Holding Tank - Mr. Kelly read a part of the report on the incident that occurred March 31 (see attached). Mr. Starkey explained the situation and when he was notified he had the testing done by AECOM (formerly Earth Tech). He said the problems done by the plows over the winter were corrected by Matrix Paving. EPA will be here to look at the situation but Mr. Starkey has received positive responses on the action that was taken. Mr. Starkey informed the Board that Curtis Slayton, Water Superintendent, is going to look into having the alarm system brought into the SCADA system.

Mosquito Control - will begin on April 13 and it has been posted on channel 22.

<u>Town Float</u> - will be put in on Tuesday, April 14 depending on weather.

Mr. Starkey asked for everyone's patience on the plow damage done over the winter. He is requesting any Christmas decorations in the cemeteries be taken down.

Mr. Khan asked if the transfer station takes a count of the number of residents that use the transfer station on any given day. Mr. John said no but he could get some numbers. He asked how many seasonal laborers would be hired this year. Mr. Starkey said about 6 and it is the same as last year.

Maria Brown asked if the Board meeting that was held with Mr. Kelly was posted. She said it was a public meeting and she would like a copy of what was read by Mr. Kelly.

Maria Brown asked if this was the only time the alarm went off and how can you hear the alarm. Mr. Starkey explained the alarm should sound when it is 2/3 full. He said it could go undetected when no one there. It is a flaw and now that they are aware of it they want to correct the problem and put it on the SCADA system.

Maria Brown asked why now is it being fixed. Mr. Starkey responded that because another department head witnessed an overflow go into the seasonal brook and reported it to the EPA and DES.

Ivan Eaton commented about paving on Lower Collins Street and said if it is paved it will cause issues with the drainage that already exists. Mr. Starkey explained he would tell the paving company to find a solution to the drainage before paving the road. There was general discussion on how to correct the problem.

Cora Stockbridge questioned the meeting with the DPW. Mr. Kelly said it was on March 31 and stated who was in attendance. She questioned if the Board made any decisions at that meeting. Kelly said no decisions were made and that he brought the information to the Town Manager. The meeting was informational only to just get an idea of what was going on and what could be done to correct the problem.

David Brown asked if he had been granted a meeting per his request. Mr. Kelly said no it was not granted and that this is a personnel issue and should not be discussed in public. Maria Brown asked each Board member if they refused the meeting. Mr. Khan said he depends on the Town Manager's recommendation and Mr. Moore said a letter was sent with the response.

Mr. Brenner went over the issues with PMC and when they were notified of the problems.

- End contract.

There was an attempt to schedule a meeting with the Town Manager, Town Counsel and PMC but PMC had not set a time to do so.

Mr. Kelly said originally it sounded like a good idea to eliminate the sludge and save money. He said we gave them every opportunity to make it work.

Mr. Khan said he strongly believes if they don't take a position the safety and health issues of the employees and residents could be much bigger. He said the dollars to the Town are adding up rather quickly. He is concerned with the upcoming summer months with tourists and businesses opening.

Mr. Moore said he is favor of terminating the contract, as his main concern is the residents and their wellbeing.

Maria Brown commented this should have happened much quicker than it did.

Cora Stockbridge questioned the budget and the default budget. She thinks it may be an error and where did the \$190K come from. Mr. Brenner explained how the figures were calculated.

Asa Knowles asked if the second motion on PMC would interfere with the first motion to terminate. Mr. Brenner said it is just a legal action to terminate the contract. Mr. Kelly said it would go back to the old system and the process is shut down.

Paula Wood asked how long the process is to go back to the old system. Mr. Knowles said the process would be shut down immediately. He explained the process needed to get rid of what is already there.
